### **THE TERRY LAUBISCH MAPLE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES**

It is the intent of this Foundation to promote the future of the maple syrup industry by funding an annual scholarship of \$250/student to one or more eligible college students in memory of Terry Laubisch, one of the founding members of the NYS Maple Foundation. Scholarships are awarded based on academic and leadership excellence and involvement in the maple syrup industry. To qualify, an applicant:

1. Must be either an immediate or extended family member of a NY maple syrup operation OR an employee of a NY maple farm.
2. Must be attending a 2 or 4 year college as a freshman during the year in which the scholarship is awarded.
3. Must submit the following by March 15:
  - A. A completed and signed Laubisch Scholarship application for the current year (which is available online at [www.newyorkmaple.org](http://www.newyorkmaple.org)). It is also available upon request from Remi Link (address below).
  - B. A copy of the high school transcript, including a list of extra-curricular activities and offices held, if any.
  - C. A recent photo (will not be returned) with permission to use it in any NYSMF publication.
  - D. An essay with no more than 3 pages addressing any or all of the following topics:
    - a) how your education will impact you and your involvement in the maple syrup industry;
    - b) your past experiences with the maple syrup industry;
    - c) what REAL maple syrup means to you;
    - d) any other comments or points you wish to make, as this is your chance to let the committee know who YOU are!
  - E. Must have a letter of reference from Farm Supervisor or High School Teacher sent DIRECTLY to the address below.
